Events: A variety of social and educational events, including the Artists Helping Artists (AHA) free workshops taught by SWWS members and guests - monthly, except July – August and December.

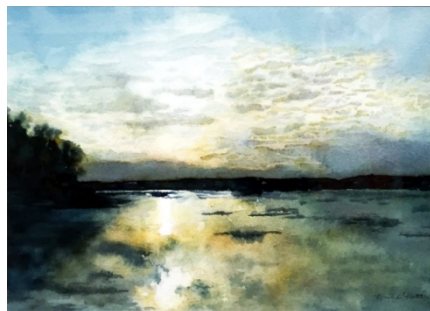

Associate Membership

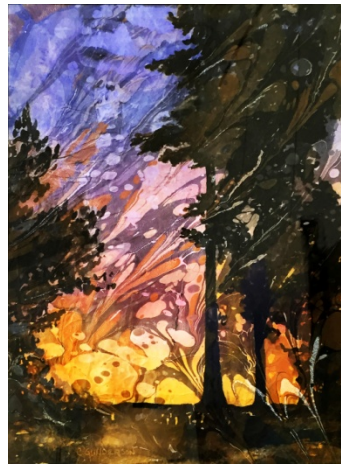
Initially, all artists join as Associate members. Dues are \$25 per calendar year. Associates receive the Art Facts Newsletter (via email) and may enter work in the Annual Spring Show. Associates may apply for Juried Membership each spring and fall by submitting three paintings (one must be transparent watercolor) to the membership committee.

Juried Membership

Dues for Juried members are \$35 per calendar year. Juried members have full voting rights, are eligible to serve on the Board of Directors and may participate in the Annual Fall Show and Art in the Community Program.

Student Membership

SWWS extends Associate level membership free of charge to students enrolled full time, at least 18 years of age and studying the arts.
